

Halesowen College Accessibility Statement

This accessibility statement applies to Halesowen College's website www.halesowen.ac.uk.

The website is operated by Halesowen College (UK PRN 10002852), which is an exempt charity and established under the terms of the Further and Higher Education Act 1992.

We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. This means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver)
