## **Environmental Sustainability**

Halesowen College wishes to be known as a leader of sustainability in Further Education across the West Midlands. In meeting the current needs of our students and wider stakeholders we are committed to doing things greener, in a more sustainable way to protect the planet now and for the future.

Working towards becoming a paperless environment, we've launched our new digital prospectus, meaning we're cutting down less trees and reducing waste throughout the production process. We also provide a FREE coach service, which is a sustainable way for students to travel to college. We also use local suppliers, where possible and have various recycling outlets across our 3 campuses.

While we are making improvements, we know we can do more, therefore we are continuing to find ways to deliver on our aims of reducing energy consumption and carbon emissions, waste to landfill, pollution, paper and waste consumption.



#### Lateral Flow Testing (LFT)

The college strongly encourages students to continue regular lateral flow testing. Up to one-third of people who have coronavirus are asymptomatic. By testing, we will help to reduce the spread in the college setting through asymptomatic transmission.

Students showing any symptoms of coronavirus (a high temperature, new continuous cough or loss, or change in their sense of smell or taste) should not attend college or attempt to travel to college.

Students with these symptoms should not use the lateral flow test and should instead request a PCR test. If the result of this test is negative, students can return to college when they feel well enough. If it is positive students must self-isolate for the required period - they will be informed of the date their self isolation ends should they receive a positive PCR test result.

#### **Face Coverings**

Face coverings should be worn on college coaches and in communal areas by staff, students and visitors unless they are exempt. Face coverings are also required on public transport.

## **Learner Support Fund**

If you have a household income of £37,398 or below, or someone in the household is in receipt of certain benefits, students could receive up to £1200 per year of financial support to help with College costs such as meals, uniform, IT equipment and childcare. 

Refugees: What Role could Businesses Play? A free public lecture by Dr Laila Kasem.

This lecture will explore who refugees are, what they bring to the UK and how organisations can engage with them in a mutually beneficial way.


