Mental Health and Wellbeing

At Halesowen College we recognise that wellbeing and mental health concerns can have an impact on anyone at any time. We have a dedicated team of wellbeing advisers and counsellors who will listen, find a safe space and time to talk, show kindness and compassion, be respectful, be open and inclusive and offer support and guidance to enable success.

Our counsellors work with a wide range of issues and can offer academic support (e.g., exam stress). Our philosophy is to support learners to help themselves by finding ways to manage their difficulties in an accepting and safe environment. All learners have access to Togetherall, a support platform available 24/7.

We have invested in training over 100 staff in Mental Health First Aid to allow them to support our students further during their time at college. Staff have a badge on their lanyard to indicate they have undertaken the training meaning students can quickly identify these staff members.

LGBT+

At Halesowen College we value each of our students as individuals and want your young person to feel welcomed and supported during their time at college.

We have a thriving LGBT+ group offering a private, safe space for anyone belonging to the LGBT+ community to meet other students. We also have our Unicorn group, which welcomes learners who are transgender or questioning their gender identity to find support and make new friends.

To further support students, the college also provides students and staff with pronoun badges that they can attach to their lanyard if they wish. Also, pronouns can now be added onto email signatures. Students have the opportunity to complete a form with their personal coach, which informs college staff of the correct pronoun to be used and the student's preferred names.





HANDS ON LEARNING

Allowing students to gain hands on experience whilst learning is something that the college prides itself on. Through many of our courses students get the chance to develop their skills and knowledge through practical tasks. Halesowen College has a wide range of facilities that gives students the opportunities to experience learning differently.
