

Admissions Policy Statement: Study Programme Learners 16-19 (19-24 EHCP)

Aim

Admissions is the start of the learner journey at Halesowen College. We value each individual applicant and aim to ensure that each learner progresses onto an educational/training pathway that best suits their needs/abilities and aspirations regardless of ethnicity, gender, disability or other protected characteristic.

The College has statutory obligations for learners with an Educational, Health and Care Plan as specified in the Children & Families Act 2014 (refer to SEND Policy).

Halesowen College aims to enrol learners onto a programme where they will learn, flourish and develop the skills and knowledge they need to succeed and progress with their education and/or gain sustainable employment.

Halesowen College will in accordance with the Equality Act make reasonable adjustments to accommodate any learner to pursue their chosen course of study safely.

Where necessary adjustment(s) are not reasonable or where reasonable adjustment(s) cannot enable the applicant to study safely then the enrolment cannot be actioned. In such circumstances an alternative course of study may be offered or the applicant signposted to other providers and services as appropriate.

It may be necessary for the College to cease to accept applications for courses which have reached capacity. In such circumstances suitable alternative study programmes may be offered or a referral made to other agencies/providers.

Entry Requirements

Halesowen College publishes entry requirements for each course. Offers of places onto study programmes are subject to the learner achieving the required academic standard. Where this is not achieved advice and guidance will be offered to explore options for an alternative programme.
